First, the good news is that Scouts Canada has extended all youth membership to December 31, 2020. This will allow youth to participate in scouting in the fall without the need to register. There will be a registration for 2021 and details will be provided once we have them.

However, it will be important for you to confirm whether your child will be returning in September. Sections Scouters will reach out in August asking whether they will be returning. Those moving up sections, will be contacted by their new Section Scouters.

Scouts Canada is currently consulting on draft guidelines for returning to some in-person scouting activities in the Fall. It seems like these will only be outdoor activities with certain precautions put in place. Some camping will also be permitted. All Scouters and parents are welcome to provide feedback. Once we have more details of the actual guidelines, those will be communicated to you.



- Chloe Rosenbloom


