The survival skills learned from week one were put to good use as in the third week when we embarked on a treacherous journey from the Church Hall to Weston Park, skillfully navigating

the rugged terrain and encountering the wild inhabitants of Elmvale Acres. Despite these perils, the youth were able to remain calm under pressure, and in the process learned the skills of navigating and map-reading using landmarks, the sun and a compass. It was fortunate that provisions were provided at our destination; otherwise we may never have made it back.



In-between all the survival stuff, the Cubs had a fun bowling night. Competition and comradeship was high as they all cheered each other on, while still trying to beat out their fellow Cubs in the next lane.
