Scout Trails

The Scouts final meeting of the year was June 5th. It was an extremely busy night for Cubs, Scouts and leaders alike as some finished core badge work, finalized the camp menu for the Council camp, learned light packing tips from Venturer Shiloh while other leaders coordinated camp gear packing and final payments of the year towards the Jamboree. There were 5 youth and 3 leaders who learned basic canoe skills, canoe rescue, planned their canoe camp menu, and reviewed gear & packing list all in a lead-up to our first ever spring canoe camp.



There were 3 leaders, 4 Cubs and 8 Scouts that attended the Voyageur Council Troop Camp "Survivor 2015" at Camp Opemikon, June 7-9th. They were divided into 12 Tribes for the weekend that found them meeting new friends, learning new skills, teamwork and overcoming their fears as they took part in the following activities: high ropes course; low ropes course; raft building; canoe soccer; shelter building; and an obstacle course. The 4 Cubs made the Bonus cooking challenge for the judges that consisted of roast potatoes & bison followed by a dessert of angel food cake, raspberries and Cool Whip. It was praised quite highly at the Tribal Campfire but the Polar Bears (Damir) were the winning tribe that weekend with an overall score of 192 points. Everyone had an awesome weekend and got a cool crest and Survivor Buff as a souvenir.









At the year-end group party on June 9th, we raised \$87.50 for the 9 Scouts attending ScotiaJamb from July 11-17 in Nova Scotia.

The Scouts also held a final SAIL fundraiser for the Jamboree in order to raise final funds to cover incidental fees. The participating youth split \$453.50 towards their costs and one customer made a \$50 donation to the event. This was followed by a final planning meeting for leaders and youth to finalize flight itineraries and collection of trip documents towards this big trip.
