Registration Information

Last year, Scouts Canada changed the registration period for youth members. It is now on a calendar year basis. That means, you do <u>not</u> need to register to continue scouting this Fall 2021.

Early registration will open on September 1st for those who want to secure their spots for the 2022 year. It will then open on September 15th for new members to join. Any new members joining After September 15th will be able to also participate in Fall 2021 if there is space in the section they are joining. So, that's 16 months for the price of 12.

Our registration fee for 2022 will be \$235.
